Language Arts

Spelling Lesson 30 – Spell words with initial consonant digraphs wh and th. Recognize and spell antonyms (words that mean the opposite). Spell compound words. Recognize the short e sound in again.

Math

Problem of the Day – Mrs. Finkle’s class collected 63 canned foods and 14 juice boxes in a food drive. 16 of the canned foods and 7 of the juice boxes were expired and couldn’t be donated. How many items did Mrs. Finkle’s class donate?

Calendar Measurement Booklet – It has a Pre/Post Test page on the front and came home in Learning Package #3. Students may work at their own pace on this booklet all week but remind them that spelling counts!

Have the children watch the video on money that is linked to the Weebly.

Money – Go over the values of money and have them sort change and count individually...nickels, dimes, quarters, loonies, toonies and then have them add the totals together. For a challenge, mix all the coins up and try adding up the amounts. You could create a small store and put prices on various toys to practice as well. For a challenge, see if they can be the store keeper and figure out how to give back change (the difference between what something costs and the amount of money given – have them count up to find). This will be challenging but a great skill to think about as I have found that many adults don’t seem to know how to do this.

Have the children watch the video on telling time that is linked to the Weebly.

Time– We will be going over telling time this week as well, if you want to practice. Have the kids create a clock out of cardboard. Cut out an hour hand and minute hand. You can use a pencil to hold them in place while moving them to find different times.
